### Menlo and Castilleja sharpen golf games in WBAL action

Menlo School's girls' golf team remained undefeated in West Bay Athletic League play, narrowly escaping with a 227-232 victory over Sacred Heart Prep in a match played at Sharon Heights on Tuesday.

The Knights (7-0, 8-0) take on Harker (6-1 WBAL) on Wednesday at Palo Alto Hills GC with a chance to take charge of the league race.

Palo Alto High placed four runners in the top 10, led by senior Kent **Slaney**'s individual victory, and the Vikings claimed the team title at the second league meet Tuesday.

The meet was held on the Crystal Springs Course in Belmont, where the CCS final meet will take place on Nov. 12.

CCS officials were forced to move the meet from Toro Park in Salinas as it is still being used by Cal Fire and the USFS to deal with the Soberanes Fire.

**Slaney** paced the field with a 15:23.3 over the 2.95-mile course. Henry Saul finished third in 15:51.6 while Gunn's Jonas Enders was fourth in 15:58.8.

Sam Craig placed sixth in 16:03.3 and Spencer Morganfeld ran eighth in 16:10.5. Senior Ben Beaury ran 16:52.2 and finished 21st.

Freshman Justin Chiao was Gunn's second runner, placing 18th in 16:50.8. Thomas Burton was 27th in 16:58.9.

Palo Alto scored 39, with Monta Vista placing second with 86 points. Gunn was fifth with 140 points.

The Gunn girls ran third with 107 points while Palo Alto scored 193 for seventh. Mountain View won the team title with 61 points.

Five freshmen placed among the top 11, including Palo Alto's Miranda Jimenez. Cupertino's Oriana Jalal won the race in 18:26.0, followed by Los Gatos' Annika Paylor. Jimenez was seventh in 19:35.1, just behind Lynbrook's Alisha Naidu. Mountain View's Shannon Gould was 11th.

Gunn junior Natalie Hill race 19:44.9, edging Paly's Julia Doubson by less than one second. Joyce Shea ran 13th and Proya Thomas was 20th for the Titians.
