Big races short and long pace Paly boys, Menlo girls

Competition arrived from within for the Palo Alto High distance runners.

Kent Slaney led a Paly sweep in the boys 1,600 Friday at the Santa Clara Valley Athletic League track and field championships at Los Gatos High. It wasn't an easy firstplace finish, as teammate Reed Foster battled Slaney down the stretch.

Slaney's winning time was a season-best 4:21.84. Foster was second in 4:23.60 and Sam Craig came in third in 4:25.17.

When Slaney went for his second win of the meet in the 3,200 the battle he waged with Foster took its toll when fresh-legged sophomore teammate Henry Saul, in his first race of the meet, kicked past him to take first place in personal-best 9:21.73.

"He ran a great race," Palo Alto coach Michael Davidson said of Saul. "He sat right off the lead, ran smooth and relaxed."

Slaney, who led for 95 percent of the race, was timed in a season-best 9:22.83. Another teammate, senior Naveen Pai, came in fourth (9:34.73) as the Vikings loaded up on points in the distance events.
